
## **Write an Ekphrastic Poem!**

## Art Idea:

- » Write an ekphrastic poem using *Gutherie, The Coal Miner* as inspiration. (An ekphrastic poetry is a vivid description of a scene or, more commonly, a work of art. You can invent dialog, create a story, ask questions, or reflect on what details in the painting mean or, you can relate the painting to your own life.)

After you write your poem you can place it on green rectangle in Chakeres Gallery to share with other visitors or you can take it with you.
