Annette Eshelman has shown her textile art internationally in museums and galleries. For more information, visit her website at www.aeshelman.com.



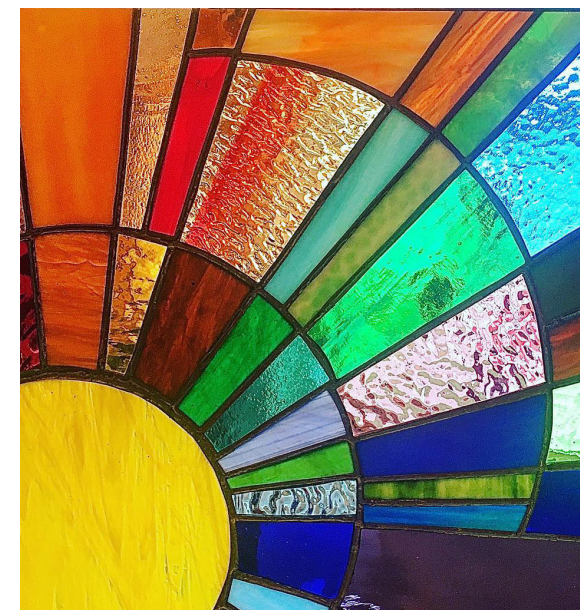

Stained Glass Class I \$95

Wednesdays, Sep 15-Oct 6, 2021, 6-8pm

This course is designed both for those who are new to calligraphy and those who have already studied calligraphy here at the Museum. Beginners will learn how to form letters using ink and Speedball pens with style C nibs. Non-beginners will review and expand on what they already know. All students will develop a deeper understanding of and appreciation for shapes, angles, spaces, and design.

Anne will wear a mask and hopes that everyone else will as well. She will email everyone before classes begin.

Fundamentals of Drawing I \$80

Drawing is considered the foundation for work in all the visual arts. Drawings can be made as finished works of art but also as a first step in preparation for watercolor, acrylic and oil painting, and even sculpture. This class will introduce the beginner to the following elements of drawing: line and shape, light and dark values, composition, perspective and ways to manipulate the material for various effects.
