Shapes of People Instructions

Shapes of People is a drawing game for all ages, inspired by master of art and play, author Herve Tullet. Tullet writes books that preschool children love, and families of all ages enjoy his playful way with art. In this game, players all need something to draw or paint with and a surface large enough for everyone to mark on at the same time (paper, blackboard, cereal box cut open, etc.). One person is the "caller" and can also draw, if they wish.

» The caller says, "Get ready, draw rectangles!" and everyone draws rectangles and/or squares. The caller calls "Stop!" when they want to.


» Move the paper, or move the players, so everyone has drawings near them that they did not do.


» The caller says, "Get ready, add a circle to one side!" and everyone adds a circle to one side of a rectangle or square. The caller calls "Stop!" when they want to.

» Move the paper, or move the players, so everyone is near drawings that are new to them.

» The caller says, "Make people!" and can be more specific, if they wish, saying, "Add eyes! Add mouths! Add ears! Add hands! Add legs!" and on and on until the paper is jumbled with animated people and the players are laughing.
