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4-Week Sessions

Beginning Calligraphy | \$65

Saturdays, Apr 18-May 9, 10-11:30am Instructor: Anne Kazez. Ages: 15+ Limit: 8. Most supplies included.

This class is designed for those with no experience in calligraphy. We will start with the basics of using ink with Speedball pens and style C nibs. Students will learn how individual letters are formed and then how those letters are combined to create words. Students will develop an eye for angles, shapes, and spacing as they relate to calligraphy.

Intermediate Calligraphy | \$65

Saturdays, May 23-Jun 13, 10-11:30am Instructor: Anne Kazez. Ages: 15+ Limit: 8. Most supplies included.

This class is for those who have already taken Beginning Calligraphy at the Museum. You will continue to develop your ability to notice details and to create your own unique variations on letters. The class will include a range of levels, so instruction will be very individualized.

Anne will email everyone before classes begin.

Stained Glass I \$70 per session or \$130 for two sessions

Session 1: Sunday Afternoons, Apr 19-May 10, 1-3pm Session 2: Wednesdays, Apr 22-May 13, 6-8pm Session 3: Wednesdays, May 20-Jun 10, 6-8pm Instructor: Tami Prince. Ages: 15+ Limit: 8. Supplies included.

Enjoy 4, 8 or 12 stained glass classes, for all levels, beginners to advanced students. Turn beautiful stained glass into wonderful pieces of art to take home and proudly display. After selecting a pattern (depending on level) and glass, you will then take your glass and score to break, grind, copper foil (Tiffany method), solder, patina (or not) and clean.

For your protection please bring safety glasses and wear closed-toe shoes.

Intro to Relief Printmaking | \$70

Thursdays, Apr 23-May 14, 6-8pm Instructor: Casey Moorman. Ages: 15+ Limit:10. Most supplies included.

In this introductory class, students will learn the technique of traditional relief printmaking using linoleum. Students will learn tool care and handling, an understanding of different hand-printing methods, and learn how to print using a hand operated press.

6-Weeks Session

Oil Painting for the Beginner | \$90

Wednesdays, Apr 22-May 27, 6-8pm Instructor: Kelley Booze. Ages 15+ Limit: 10.

Want to try oil painting? In this class, students will learn the basics of oil painting in a step-by-step process. Students will paint from still life motifs as a group while also receiving individual guidance.

Some prior drawing experience is recommended. A supply list will be emailed at time of enrollment.

8-Week Sessions

Watercolor Studies | \$125

Wednesdays, Apr 22-Jun 10, 9:30am to noon Thursdays, Apr 23-Jun 11, 1:30-4pm Instructor: Enid Willard. Ages 15+ Limit: 10.

Enjoy a supportive environment of instruction and group sharing. Work from still life, photographs, or pursue personal projects. Learn to render textures and seasonal scenes, and try creative techniques with wax, collage and more. A supply list for student purchase will be available at the first class.

On first day, bring a set of watercolor paints, watercolor paper, watercolor brushes, pencil and eraser.

Beginning to Intermediate Watercolor | \$110

Wednesdays, Apr 22-Jun 12, 6-8pm Instructor: Casey Moorman, Ages 15+ Limit:10. In this introductory class, we will explore the world of watercolor by experimenting with paints, brushes, and various watercolor techniques. We will work from subject matter ranging from still lifes to photographs. No artistic background is necessary and all levels are welcome. Please provide email address at time of registration, and a supply list will be sent prior to the first class.

Fundamentals of Drawing | \$110

Wednesdays, Apr 22-Jun 10, 2-4pm Instructor: Kelley Booze. Ages 15+ Limit: 10.

Drawing is considered the foundation for work in all the arts. Drawings can be made as finished works of art but also as a first step in preparation for watercolor, acrylic and oil painting, and even sculpture. This class will introduce the beginner to the following elements of drawing: line and shape, light and dark values, composition, perspective and ways to manipulate the material for various effects.

Young Artists' Workshop | \$90

Saturdays, Apr 18-Jun 13 10-11:30am (ages 7-9) Noon-1:30pm (ages 10-14) Instructor: Brooke Griffin. Limit: 10. Supplies included. *Please note: no class on Sat, May 9!

For new and returning students with a strong interest in art. Learn fundamentals of art through 2-D and 3-D art projects. Draw from observation, paint, construct, and more! Gallery visits allow students to sketch and respond to art.
