

8-Week Sessions

Toddler Art Exploration: \$35

Fridays, Jan 18-Mar 8, 9:30-10 am

Instructor: Amy Korpieski, Age 2 (with adult companion)

Gallery admission before and after class is included so you may extend your art exploration on your own. Early Childhood Art Exploration: \$70

Fridays, Jan 18-Mar 8, 10-11 am

Instructor: Amy Korpieski, Ages 3-5 (with adult companion)

Homeschool Arts: \$90

Fridays, Jan 25-Mar 15, 10-11:30am (ages 7-9); Noon-1:30pm (ages 10-14)

Instructor: Kelley Booze. Limit: 10.

Discover your creativity! Learn the elements and principals of art and design by exploring the museum galleries, working with various 2-D and 3-D media, and trying new techniques. This class includes interactive games in the galleries and lessons that emphasize current museum exhibitions. No prior experience or talent is necessary and all skill levels are welcome.

Young Artists' Workshop: \$90

Saturdays, Jan 26-Mar 16, 10-11:30am (ages 7-9), Noon-1:30pm (ages 10-14)

Instructor: TBA. Limit: 10.

For new and returning students with a strong interest in art. Learn fundamentals of art through 2-D and 3-D art projects. Draw from observation, paint, construct, and more! Gallery visits allow students to sketch and respond to art. No specific experience or talent is required.

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2D for Teens: \$90

Thursdays, Jan 24-Mar 14, 6-7:30pm

Instructor: Emma Nesselroade, Ages 14-18. Limit: 10.

This class is designed for artists 14-18 looking to explore different forms of two-dimensional art and hone their skills in a variety of media and techniques. In this 8-week class we will cover the basics of drawing, printmaking, painting, and mixed media. No previous experience is required.

Beginning to Intermediate Watercolor: \$110

Wednesdays, Jan 23-Mar 13, 6-8pm

Instructor: Casey Moorman, Ages 15 – adult. Limit: 10.

In this introductory class, we will explore the world of watercolor by experimenting with paints, brushes, and various watercolor techniques. We will work from subject matter ranging from still lifes to photographs. No artistic background is necessary and all levels are welcome. Please bring paint, brushes and 140 lb. watercolor paper to the first class.

Portrait Painting in Oil: \$110

Thursdays, Jan 24-Mar 14, 6-8 pm

Instructor: Casey Moorman, Ages 15 – adult. Limit: 10.

This class is accessible to all levels of students. Casey will teach the basic use of materials, as well as facial anatomy, composition, and the importance of value within portraiture. Students will learn how to tone canvas, practice mixing skin tones, and lay out an underpainting. Please bring your own canvas, as well as a reference photo with strong lighting. Please provide an email at the time of sign up so the instructor can email each student with a supply list.

Printmaking Basics: \$110

Thursdays, Jan 24-Mar 14, 6-8pm

Instructor: Kelley Booze, Ages 15 – adult. Limit: 10.

Learn the history and basic techniques of printmaking in this hands-on class. Students will learn different printmaking styles through demonstrations and experiment with each process to make unique prints of their own. Most supplies will be provided, however, a small supply list will be given on the first day of class.

Fundamentals of Drawing: \$110

Wednesdays, Jan 23-Mar 13, 1-3pm

Instructor: Kelley Booze Ages 15 – Adult. Limit: 10.

Drawing is considered the foundation for work in all the arts. Drawings can be made as finished works of art but also as a first step in preparation for watercolor, acrylic, and oil painting, and even sculpture. This class will introduce the beginner to the following elements of drawing: line and shape, light and dark values, composition, perspective and ways to manipulate the material for various effects. This class is also great for students looking to refresh and refine their current drawing skills. On the

first day, students should bring a 14"x17" drawing pad and 2H graphite pencil.

Painting with Pastels: \$100

Sundays, Jan 20-Mar 10, 1-3 pm

Instructor: Kelley Booze, Ages 15 – adult. Limit: 10.

Learn easy techniques to master this medium. Students will use soft pastels to create colorful still lifes and landscapes. All skill levels are welcome but basic drawing skills are needed. Returning students are welcome. Please provide your email address at registration; a supply list will be emailed to students prior to the first class.

Watercolor Studies: \$125

Thursdays, Jan 24-Mar 14, 1:30-4pm

Instructor: Enid Willard

Enjoy a supportive environment of instruction and group sharing. Work from still life, photographs, or pursue personal projects. Learn to render textures and seasonal scenes, and try creative techniques with wax, collage and more. A supply list for student purchase will be available at the first class. On first day, bring a set of watercolor paints, watercolor paper, watercolor brushes, pencil and eraser.

4-Week Sessions

Calligraphy: \$65

Saturdays, Jan 19-Feb 9, 10:30-noon, ages 16 and up

Instructor: Anne Kazez. Limit 10. Some supplies included.

This class is designed for beginners and those with minimal experience in calligraphy. We will start with the basics of using pen and ink. Students will learn how individual letters are formed and then how those letters are combined to create words. Students will develop an eye for angles, shapes, and spacing as they relate to calligraphy.

Stained Glass: \$70 per session or \$130 for both sessions

Session 1: Wednesdays, Jan 16-Feb 13, 6-8pm

Session 2: Wednesdays, Feb 20-Mar 13, 6-8pm

Instructor: Sara Gray, Ages 15 – adult. Limit: 8.

Ever wonder how those amazing stained glass pieces are made? This is your chance to learn and make one for yourself. Beginning Students will create a stained glass sun catcher, while returning students can fine tune their skills for more complex designs. All students are welcome to sign up for both sessions. Instruction will cover: cutting, grindings, foil methods, and soldering. Supplies included. Students are asked to bring goggles (from any hardware or craft store) and to wear closed toe shoes.
