4-Week Sessions

Intermediate Calligraphy: \$65

Saturdays, Jul 27-Aug 17, 10-11:30 am

Instructor: Anne Kazez

Ages: 15+ Limit: 8. Most supplies included.

This class is for those who have already taken the beginning calligraphy class at the Museum. You will continue to work with the Bookhand alphabet, sharpening your ability to notice details and creating your own unique variations on the basic alphabet. Stained Glass Class: \$70 per session

Wednesday Evenings, 6 -8pm, Jul 17-Aug 7

Saturday Mornings, 10am-noon, July 20-Aug 10

Instructor: Tami Prince,

Ages: 15+ Limit: 8.

This class is for all levels. Beginning students will create a stained-glass sun catcher. Returning students can fine-tune their skills for more complex designs. Instruction will cover cutting, grinding, foil methods, and soldering. This class will send you on your way to becoming a glass artist and you will leave class with a finished piece. Supplies included. Students are asked to bring goggles (from any hardware or craft store) and to wear closed-toe shoes.

5-Week Session

Books and Art! \$65

Thursdays, Jul 18-Aug 15, 9:30-11am

Ages: 4-6, with adult companion. Limit: 10.

Each week we will explore a literary theme and create art based on our readings. Kids will get to work with a variety of media, including paints and collage. We will spend time exploring the Museum grounds, inside and out! Come prepared to spend time outside and get your hands messy with paint and other stuff.

Workshops

Art + Nature: \$70

Tuesday-Friday, Jul 23-26, 2-4pm

Instructor: Blythe Hazellief

Ages: 8-10 Limit: 10.

In this workshop, participants will look for patterns and inspiration in nature. We will examine flora and fauna through outdoor exploration of the museum grounds, viewing of the Museum exhibits, and hands-on examination of natural items from the instructor's personal collection. We will use a variety of mediums including pen and ink, pencils, and watercolors. All materials will be provided.

Geometric Expressions in Art: \$70

Tuesday-Friday, July 30-Aug 2, 2-4pm

Instructor: Blythe Hazellief, Ages: 11-13 Limit: 10.

This workshop provides participants with a set of S.T.E.A.M. inspired art projects. We will look for patterns and geometric elements in art, inspired by the works of M.C. Escher, Charley and Edie Harper, Edna Andrade, Nadir Afonso and others. We will access the Museum's permanent collection to observe works relevant to our

theme, and we will utilize various mediums to create original works. No artistic experience is required. Participants can choose to work in their favorite medium at any time. All materials will be provided, but feel free to bring any of your favorite personal supplies!

Art in 5 Senses: \$12/per session

Ages: 2-3, with adult companion. Limit: 10.

These exploratory art hours are set up in stations where twos and threes (with their adult companion) can explore art through all five senses. It will be a "move at your own pace" hour of fun creativity meant to inspire families to try sensory art at home. Admission to the galleries is included in the fee. Attend one or both sessions!
